Hart Field Site Winter Walk

Farmers and ag industry personnel braved a chilly start for Hart's annual Winter Walk on July 18, though a bit of gas heating and some hot coffee kept around 80 attendees reasonably warm inside for the first part of the event.

Considering new tools to help farmers assess risk v reward when making decisions, with a particular focus on nitrogen applications, was first on the agenda, led by Barry Mudge (farmer / Barry Mudge Consulting), Peter Hayman (Climate Scientist, SARDI) and Rebekah Allen (Research & Extension Manager, Hart).

After a morning tea break, Hart's 2023 intern, Kaidy Morgan gave an overview of her work at Hart and the season so far, highlighting several new projects and a great new animated video series she's been working on, with Episode 1 out now (you can watch it here:

https://www.hartfieldsite.org.au/pages/resources/from-our-interns/harriets-hart-headlines.php).

Then, it was out into the trial site where Navneet Aggarwal (SARDI Clare) and Jordan Bruce (Trengove Consulting) discussed crop safety and weed management issues in lentils, followed by Craig Prior (Elders) and Rebekah Allen (Hart) who are working on a project exploring alternatives to glyphosate, including why we should be considering these options and how to incorporate these strategies effectively.

After that, it was back up to the shed for lunch which was not only a great opportunity for everyone to catch up socially but also valuable time for networking and some great conversations between farmers and our guest presenters.

The next event on the Hart calendar is the Hart Field Day so make sure you keep September 19 free!

South Terrace Upgrade

Wakefield Regional Council have allocated funds in the 2023/2024 budget to improve South Terrace and surrounding areas. The works will include the following:

- * Formalise the carpark adjacent to the sporting precinct.
- * Relocate the main entrance of the sporting ground to the east .
- * Landscape the area between the road and the carpark.
- * Install underground drainage from the carpark to west of Mugge Court.
- * Shift the entrance of Mugges Court to the western end as there is a proposal to relocate the war memorial back away from the road and to the east.
- * Kerbing and sealed shoulder on the southern side of South Tce from Burney St to just west of the proposed entrance to Mugges Crt
- * Renew kerbing on the northern side from the old Hospital to Harley St incorporating improvements to the stormwater drainage in August St from South Tce to Moore St.
- * John St and Harley St intersection upgrade to support heavy vehicle access.
