

DONAVA awarded Master Breeder



South Australia saw no less than five breeders awarded Master Breeder status over the last year and local Donava Holsteins was one of them.

Gary Zweck of Donava Holsteins has spent 44 years in the dairy industry and has followed in his parent's footsteps by winning a second Master Breeder title. The first award went to his parents Don and Elva Zweck.

As a second generation dairy farmer, Gary started his dairy career on the farm with his father in Blyth, SA. His parents Don and Elva (whose names combined make up their prefix) bought the farm in 1964 and started off by separating cream

Convinced by a neighbour to transition into whole milk, Don and Elva built the dairy in 1970 and began supplying Golden North in Clare, and shortly after established the stud. His father was quick to adopt herd testing and immediately got involved when it became privatised by the state government.

Gary and his father separately enrolled in Al courses in the 1970's and used their new found knowledge to progress genetics within the herd. "Dad was always quick to be open to take on new technologies" says Gary.

He explains that during the time his father was involved in herd testing and AI breeding, he became aware of the benefits of these tools when coupled with better feed management.

Progress was being made and at that time, Donava Holsteins achieved high production far beyond the state average. Gary states that seeing the potential and progress within the herd gave him further determination and drive to improve. Mr Zweck says his success is also attributed to his father Don's interest in new and progressive farming ideologies which resulted in a pivotal business revelation. "We worked out that confined feeding in our low rainfall environment of 350mm average, was a better way to go than trying to graze" says Gary.

Due to their very low rainfall environment and no irrigation, Gary, Ros and son Justin have fine-tuned their TMR system, concentrating on producing home grown fodder and grain and delivering it to the herd for maximum benefit. "You can see straight away that if you get the feeding right and the breeding right that you will actually be rewarded with high production and that was the drive for me to keep going."

Mr Zweck admits he was shocked to learn he had won the award because he wasn't aware that it could be won more than once. "I was very surprised to win it a second time" says Gary. "I thought you could only win it once and we haven't changed our prefix at all so it rolls on from generation to generation".

Mr Zweck says he wouldn't be nearly as accomplished if it weren't for his family. "My wife Ros continues to be a great support to me over the years, handling all the registrations, calf rearing and book-keeping and my son Justin has taken on the role of cropping management and is keen on progressing into the future" says Gary.

Over the next 5 years, Gary and his family have big plans to invest in their newly built shade shed and are currently building infrastructure underneath which will incorporate a feed lane and compost loafing area.

"We look forward to the day when the cows can be shaded from the hot summer. We've got a fairly aggressive plan on the new shed and if we can handle it and get it done then our next step is to invest in robotic milking. I'm hoping that will be a chance to wind back my hours a bit" says Gary. He says winning the Master Breeder for a second time means that he and his family are on track.

"All the hard work is paying off and we are seeing the results of improved genetics and production. It's very pleasing to realise it's achievable" says Mr Zweck.

Congratulations to Gary, Ros, and the whole Donava team.

Kristin's contribution to the community is volunteering, her list of roles and duties are extensive for a 26 year old. Kristin is heavily involved in the Blyth Tennis Club, Blyth Snowtown Netball Club and Blyth Netball Club as well as other community organisations and events.

Kristin took on her first official role at age 15, in 2009, as a netball coach of the J4s (7-9 year olds). Since then, Kristin has coached junior J2s in 2010, 15U in 2015 & senior B2s in 2017 to the Grand Final and again in 2019 to the Preliminary Final. In 2014, at age 20, Kristin joined the Blyth Snowtown Netball Club (BSNC) committee and is still a member of the committee today and no doubt for many years to come. She gladly agreed to take on the executive role of Secretary in 2017 for 2 years and handled it right from the get-go and was always efficient. Since 2012, Kristin has also taken on major roles such as Club Reporter, Cat Chat Coordinator and Umpire Coordinator. In 2019, Kristin was awarded the honourable and well-deserved Blyth Snowtown Netball Club Volunteer of the Year. Throughout all of these years Kristin has also been a very capable and regular umpire, committed 200+ game player and a welcoming friend to new and old netball members.

Kristin has been and is currently an active part of the newly formed Blyth Snowtown Netball and Football Social Committee since 2018. Kristin recognises the value of social events within the community, as well as working collaboratively with the Blyth Snowtown Football Club to increase connection. She works tirelessly to organise events and encourage other young people to contribute and attend. Kristin is currently the Treasurer. Kristin has also been an active member and player of the Blyth Tennis Club. Her main roles include; committee member for at least the past 5 years, Secretary for the past 4 seasons and A grade captain, which involves a great deal of time organising and managing teams. Kristin promotes participation in tennis to the wider community and is passionate about keeping the club going.

Kristin is also on the Blyth Netball Club committee and was involved in the 3rd court development project during 2017 & 2018.

At an association level, at age 21, Kristin began contributing to the wider community taking on the mammoth responsibility of North Eastern Netball Association (NENA) Recorder, which involves collecting, checking and inputting all of the scorecards for the whole association. From 2016, Kristin has attended NENA meetings as a BSNC rep confidently representing the local netball club. She has and is currently the delegate rep for Blyth Tennis Club at the Mid North Tennis Association meetings too. Outside of sport, Kristin is involved with the Blyth Management Committee, this group meets to decide new innovative ideas to make the Blyth community a safer and better place to live; she is currently the Assistant Treasurer.

For years Kristin has been available to waitress at the monthly Movie Club Nights in Blyth. She has volunteered at the Blyth Cinema. Kristin is a regular face behind the BBQ counter each year at the local street Christmas Carnival. She supports events organised by other organisations, for example the bowling club have a community night each year and Kristin submits a team of young people to get them involved.

The bigger executive roles Kristin has successfully taken on within committees are just the scratch of the surface. There are so many other smaller jobs that Kristin recognises as just as important which she fulfils. Such as, she attends AGMs, helps out at all busy bees, writes news stories for local newsletters, creates rosters for duties, does many duties within rosters, organises and attends fundraisers, organises end of season trips, helps in canteens, sets up & packs up wind-ups, contributes to strategic planning, donates food etc. The list goes on and only she knows the exact extent of her efforts! If there's a job, Kristin won't hesitate but learn to do it, there's no 'ifs' or 'buts'!

The time and effort Kristin puts into the community is astonishing. Her initiative is beyond her years. Nothing is ever too hard for Kristin and she always seems to be around to help. Kristin has a full-time job too! There's two other main notable ways Kristin has demonstrated active citizenship and enhancement of community life. The first is her desire to develop her leadership skills and the second is her ability to connect the community. Kristin's community contributions were recognised in 2017 when she

received a scholarship to participate in the inaugural Emerging Leaders Program. Kristin was nominated by local clubs to receive a scholarship from the Blyth Development Board to actively participate in this Program run by the Regional Development Australia throughout 2017 and 2018. Her past community involvement meant that she met the criteria as an active community member and next generation to serve the community. Kristin graduated from the program with skills in being an effective leader, empowering people & creating innovative solutions. She also took time to attend the Netball SA Budding Leaders Program held over 3 sessions in 2016 to develop skills in community and personal resilience, social media management and communication. Kristin is a vital part of our community as she is the link between many community members of all ages. Kristin has lived in Blyth her whole life and is welcoming to all new people, especially younger residents. In a small community like Blyth, our young people help keep our community fresh, progressive and alive. Our town tends to attract young people and families due to lower housing costs and job opportunities in close by Clare, but also our vibrant connection with neighbours and the wider community helps retain residents. Kristin encourages people to get involved and integrate within our community. Obituary - Jean Viola Wandel



Jean Viola Hampel was born on the 23 January 1928 at the Blyth Community Hospital. She was the first born child to Ben and Gert Hampel (nee Zilm), who lived on their farm East of Kybunga.

Jean left school at the age of 12, a day after the qualifying certificate exam as her mother was ill. She cared for her younger sisters Betty,

Iris and Shirley, along with running the home and milking the cows

In January 1942 her parents left for the Blyth hospital in a horse and cart as there had been heavy rain and they could not travel by car. Staying in Blyth for the birth of their baby – a still born son, Jean was busy looking after the rest of the family until her mother returned home. At this time, she was 13 and helping at home as well as being sent out to help others in the district in their time of need.

At 21 she married Erwin Wandel. Their wedding text was 1st Corinthians 13:13 "And now these three remain, Faith, Hope and Love, but the greatest of these is Love." It wasn't long and their first child Yvonne was born in February 1950, followed by Neil in October 1951, Glen in April 1953 and Trevor in August 1956.

Mum was very proud of her children, 17 grandchildren and many great grandchildren.

Mum and Dad share farmed land at Kybunga for 5 years before making their first purchase. Later as they had opportunity, more land was purchased. Erwin also did contract reaping for Rex McSkimming and through that they bought their first piano so Yvonne could have music lessons. They also bought their first TV. Mum said they only bought anything if they could pay cash for it, unless it was for farm requirements.

Mum and Dad moved to Clare in 1974 where Mum enjoyed doing voluntary work. Many times, she was heard to say that she was a Jack of all trades, and master of none.

She joined the Clare hardcourt tennis club as a player in 1979 and was President from 1982 and awarded a life membership in 1985. During her time as President she had been instrumental in grant applications and fundraising for the refurbishing of the courts in 1985. Her enthusiasm and leadership, especially for catering, allowed the club to completely finance many further upgrades of their facilities.

Jean and Erwin were actively involved in the Lutheran church where she served on the property committee and President of the Women's Guild. Once again, her experience in catering enabled the Guild membership to raise considerable funds for the Church.

Jean was Mid North and Yorke Peninsula Lutheran Zone Rep for Immanuel College Ladies Auxiliary. She was president of the

Clare and District Hospital Ladies Auxiliary where she was involved in fundraising, trolley rounds, and flower arranging. Jean and Erwin also delivered Meals on Wheels in Clare and was also an active member of the Clare Town Hall Improvements Committee. jean enjoyed her involvement in the annual Christmas production.

In 1988, she was the recipient of the Australia Day Citizen of the Year Award in Clare.

After living in Clare for 21 years, they moved to the seafront at Port Broughton where she continued her efforts for church, hospital and Visitors Centre.

Mum nursed Dad in his failing health and a few years after his passing she moved back to Clare into her lovely little home to be close to family.

More recently she was moved into Carinya Aged Care Home where the staff have been wonderful in her care and support. She passed to be with her Lord on Tuesday the 15th of December, 2020 aged 92 years.




