When Sir Lyell McEwin met Queen Elizabeth..

Sir Alexander Lyell McEwin (1897-1988), farmer and politician, was born on 29 May 1897 at Hundred of Hart, near Blyth, South Australia, youngest of four children of South Australian-born Alexander Lyell McEwin, farmer, and his wife Jessie Smilie, née Ferguson. After primary schooling at the one-teacher school at Hart, he attended Prince Alfred College, Adelaide, as a scholarship boy.

On 16 February 1921 at the Blyth Methodist Church he married Dora Winifred Williams (d.1981). He began farming on his own account on family-owned land at Wyndora, Blyth.

He also sat on the Hart school committee and Blyth Public Hospital management board, and played violin in the Clare orchestra. Engaging more widely in public life, he held leadership positions in the Blyth branch of the Agricultural Bureau of South Australia, and in 1930-41 was a member (chairman 1935-37) of the State's Advisory Board of Agriculture.

orchestra. Engaging more widely in public life, he held leadership positions in the Blyth branch of the Agricultural Bureau of South Australia, and in 1930-41 was a member (chairman 1935-37) of the State's Advisory Board of Agriculture.

Early in the 1930s he sat on State and Federal government advisory committees dealing with matters of agricultural settlement, debt adjustment and meat export. He served (1932-53) on Hutt and Hill Rivers (from 1935 Blyth) District Council. Standing in 1934 as a Liberal Country League candidate for Northern District, and campaigning as 'a practical farmer' with 'a full knowledge' of both 'agriculture in all its phases' and 'the problems of the men and women in the country', he was elected to the South Australian Legislative Council.

1958 saw Queen Elizabeth and her mother make a visit to Australia where they met with Sir Lyell McEwin.

Yvonne Carling.

Yvonne was born at the Cleve Hospital on the 17th April 1940. She was the youngest of six children and the second daughter for Morley & Zeta Rodda. Her brothers Ray, Kelvin, Trevor & Mervyn and sister Ruth always had a special bond with Yvonne and she always spoke with love and admiration for her siblings.

Yvonne lived with her family in Cleve and attended primary school there. When Yvonne was 11 the family moved to a farm at Mangalo. Yvonne continued to travel to Cleve for school on an old truck converted into a bus, then later was driven to school by her sister Ruth.

When Yvonne was 18, she moved with her parents to Kurralta Park (Adelaide). She worked at Beaumont Jewellers in the Adelaide Arcade, and it was here that she met one of her lifelong friends and future sister-in-law – Shirley Heaven, (now Rodda) who worked in the jewellery store across the arcade.

During her time in Adelaide Yvonne loved to socialise and attended many dances. Her love of sport continued to be a big part of her life. She joined the Western Youth Centre and played and coached numerous games of netball over the years, often riding her bike from her home to the Centre.

At the age of 19, Yvonne first met her husband, Max when he travelled to Adelaide with a group of local cricketers known as "The Watchman Ramblers" for a cricket carnival. The team included Yvonne's cousin Malcolm Kennett, Kevin Clarke, Ian Longmire, the Buckley brothers and the Stewart Brothers. Social events were arranged for the players each night. The boys decided they needed company of some girls and not knowing many people in Adelaide, Malcolm suggested he would give his cousin, Yvonne a call to see if she would joint them and invite some of her friends. Yvonne was not very keen or enthusiastic as she was about to leave to coach her netball team. Malcolm managed to convince Yvonne to join their group (after she finished coaching her netball team).

After meeting and getting to know Max over this time they began courting. As Yvonne didn't own a car Max would travel to Adelaide in his Volkswagen to visit her. On 9th February,1963, after a 2 ½ year courtship, Yvonne married Max in the Hare Street Methodist Church, Kurralta Park.

Once married Yvonne moved to the farm at Bowillia. Being from a farming background she loved farming life. Yvonne was not afraid of hard work or getting her hands dirty.

Their marriage was blessed with three children, Tracey, Wayne and Cherie, and later, 'in laws – Daryl, Valerie & Brenton and to their delight eight grandchildren Nicola, Cameron, Jace, Kristin, Rachel, Thomas, Tomas and Tara and three great grandchildren Matilda, Arlo & Oliver.

Yvonne was her children's greatest support and was always there whenever and wherever they needed her. After getting off the school bus, Yvonne was always ready with a cup of tea or milo, home made cake, fresh scones or biscuits for them to enjoy and would ask about their day. The children were encouraged to try their hand at anything such as sports, playing musical instruments, dance classes, concerts, school exchange trips. Anything they wanted to try (within reason) was greatly supported by Yvonne. As a keen sports person herself, Yvonne delighted in watching her children play sport and often coached the girls in netball and the three of them in tennis.

Yvonne had a big heart and was a woman of great strength and courage. She could withstand an incredible amount of pain. One morning, while helping in the sheep yards she tangled with a black Suffolk ram. Needless to say, the Ram came off better when he ran at Yvonne and damaged her knee.

This injury caused her a great deal of pain and hindered her when playing sport or working on the farm for a number of years. Yvonne was told that she would need a knee reconstruction but at the age of 40 the surgeon said she was too old and didn't want to operate. This didn't sit well with Yvonne at all. After suffering constant pain and frustration for a number of years, she went for a second option and this time the surgeon agreed to a reconstruction.

Yvonne was a great asset to the Blyth Community and fitted in well right from the start. She continued her love of dancing and went on to teach dancing lessons with Keith Glazbrook and Gwen Williams to the younger generation. The lessons were held in the Blyth Golf Club and the highlight of the night for the dance students was always the Mexican Hat Dance and the Bird Dance.

Yvonne soon became known in Blyth for her sporting ability. She was an incredibly gifted netball and Tennis player. Yvonne played and coached and was responsible for helping many girls improve their netball skills with great success which resulted in many premierships. For her contribution to the Blyth Netball Club Yvonne was awarded a Life Membership in 1980. Since Yvonne's passing many people have mentioned how they remember being coached by her and that she was the best coach they ever had but was also one of the strictest.

As with tennis, Yvonne loved playing and enjoyed coaching the juniors and organising tournaments. It pleased her immensely to see the young players continue on into the senior grades. "She was also well known for her sponge cakes topped with whipped cream and strawberries for afternoon tea – a favourite of many". Once again for her years of service, Yvonne was awarded with a Life Membership of the Blyth Tennis Club in 1984 and was also a Club Patron.

Yvonne was also involved in many other community groups including the Blyth Primary School Welfare Club where she co-ordinated mini deb balls. She was a valuable member of the Blyth Hall Committee for a number of years and was very good at catering. She co-ordinated the catering for the famous 'Bull and Bush' events that the Blyth Hall held each year. She also catered for numerous other functions including the Masonic Lodge Balls when Max was installed as the Worshipful Master of The Lodge. The children can remember hearing the Kenwood beater working in the middle of the night as she whipped up a pavlova, cream puffs or some other treat

Yvonne was one of the founding members of the Burkanedi Homes Committee that established the units in Blyth. She was secretary of this group for many years and formed good relationships with all of the tenants. Yvonne, along with other committee Members spent many hours in the gardens trimming trees and weeding.

As recognition for her many years of service and commitment to the Blyth Community, Yvonne was awarded Australia Day Citizen of the Year, in 1986.

Yvonne loved her family and especially her grandchildren and great grandchildren. She & Max would watch many sporting games, school concerts, piano concerts and always took an interest in everything her children and grandchildren did.

Mama (as known by the grandchildren) regularly looked after the grandchildren at home – often spoiling them – teaching them to cook, sew, play games and how to drive. Mama always had a stash of chocolate supposedly 'hidden away' but the grandchildren always knew where to find it.

Sadly in 2013 Yvonne was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease. This didn't affect her too much for several years and she was able to continue to live at home and live a comfortable life with Max's care and support from her family, but as the years went on it gradually worsened and for the last few years she was completely reliant on Max. His continual love and care for Yvonne allowed her to remain at home.

On Sunday 17th July Yvonne had a fall, which resulted in a fractured pelvis. She was hospitalised and finally transferred to the Carinya Aged Care Home in Clare. During Max's last visit with Yvonne her last words to him were "I Love You – Take me Home". Yvonne passed away peacefully on Tuesday 2nd August, 2022 aged 82 years.

Yvonne will always be remembered for her bubbly personality, strong character, a great role model and her willingness to do anything for anybody. She will be sadly missed by her family, friends and members of the community. Rest in peace Yvonne, we love you.



Malcolm Wandel

Malcolm John Wandel was born 24 February 1942 at Blyth Hospital to Charles and Meta Wandel.

Malcolm was the youngest of 4 children, Hedley, Valda and Ken with Valda and Ken both of whom passed away at early age. Malcolm's sanctuary was the family farm, he was born to be a farmer, telling stories as a child watching his father on the harvester out the front of the house and working out how many bags of wheat per paddock would be harvested with apricot stones.

Dad's favourite time of year was seeding, often sitting on the back of combine taking in his father's instructions. On the farm his first paid job was feeding the calves and pet lambs.

Malcolm attending Bowillia and Blyth Primary School until year 7, not a model student, but he did enjoy arithmetic and sport, which would take a big part in the future.

Malcolm was a member of the Blyth Agriculture and Rural Youth during his teens, swapping stories with fellow farmers.

1962 Malcolm's life changed were he met the love of life, on a blind date in the corridors of the old RAH where he met Kaye Garrod, which on 27 February 1965 Malcolm and Kaye married at the St Francis of Assisi, Church of England at Clarence Gardens in Adelaide.

Malcolm was a very proud man, and the three times in his that he can truly say his proudest was of his 3 children, Ian Craig, Cheryl Kaye, and Sharon Ann.

Growing up, his had a mixed farm including sheep, dairy cattle, and grain, but Malcolm had another interest in pigs, he purchased pigs at the 1963 Adelaide show and then establishing the farm as a Large White Pig Stud.

Malcolm became a pig exhibitor at the Royal Adelaide in 1964, also exhibiting at the Royal Sydney Easter show, Royal Melbourne, and various SA regional shows. During the time involved with the pigs he took on several roles including President of SA Pig Breeders and Life Member, President of the Federal Pig Breeders Association and Life Member also serving as the Director of Australian Pig Breeders Association in Kiama in NSW.

He was a member of the Dairy Cattle, Goat and Pig Committee at the Royal Adelaide Show, serving Vice Chairman and then Chairman of the committee and honour that Malcolm received was being a Show Councillor for 20 years and then an Honorary Councillor. Malcolm judged pigs at all Royal Show's around Australia, Toowoomba, Melbourne, Brisbane, Perth, and Sydney. Malcolm loved attending livestock sales, he had a reputation with Livestock Agents that he was a man on a mission, ensuring he got the best deal whether it was pigs or sheep.

Malcolm's community and being involved was extremely important to him. He served as Chirman of the Blyth Primary School Council for 2 years and committee member for 10 years. Malcolm became involved in local government for the 23 years, with three different councils. He was Deputy Chairman for 2 years and 7 years at Blyth Council and amalgamated in 1987 with the Snowtown District Council and became Deputy Chairman for 4 years, before amalgamation with the District Council of Wakefield Plains in 1997. During in time in council he was also involved in Blyth Community Hall, Mid North Pest and Plant, LGA delegate, Balaklava Hospital Board, Balaklava Lions Club, Burkanendi Homes Trust and Blyth Lutheran Trinity Church as member of the property committee.

Malcolm was co-recipient of Australia Day Citizen of Year Award in 1984. Also represent the council as Lady Wandel at the Mock Deb Ball in 1981 by the Blyth Netball Club.

Malcolm loved sport, was a keen cricket played for Watchman Cricket Club and later Blyth/Kybunga Cricket Club in the 1960's. He reformed B Garde and Colts side in 1974 and captaining the B Grade too. He loved watching cricket live or on the TV, and he was traditional bloke, loved the long form rather than the pyjama stuff. Malcolm loved his football whether it be Blyth, Blyth/Snowtown, Norwood, or the Adelaide Crows he just loved watching live or the TV.

Dad passion for the local football team continued to the end, playing for the Blyth Football Club until 1966, during his at the club he was Captain for the first time in 1956. After retirement he held the office Vice President, President, and Life Member, also volunteering as a goal umpire, mentoring upcoming goal umpires for the club. When the decision to the join Blyth Football Club and Snowtown Football Club was to be made, Malcolm was given to casting vote to join and the rest is now history.

He became the inaugural President of the Blyth Snowtown Football Club in 1988, also was Treasurer for 5 years, and he was honoured with the Club Patron in 2008 till 2020. He was also a NEFL Delegate and a League Commissioner for 10 years. One of the most memorable times for him a Patron was awarding the A Grade premiership medals at the 2019 Grand Final at Burra.

Dad loved his Adelaide Crows, being a Foundation Member of the club, watching Crows matches at Artic Park (Football Park), Adelaide Oval and especially in Melbourne for the 1998 Grand Final seeing the Adelaide Crows winning over North Melbourne.

Another achievement in his life was being involved with the Blyth Bowling Club and playing with Kaye and Ian during the years. Dad started playing lawn bowls in 1981, with many roles he took on at the club and association, including Tournament Secretary,

Committee member, Men's selector, Social Director, President of the Night Owls and organiser and President of the club for 3 years. His involvement in the association was Mid North Round Robing and association Selector and Mid North Recorder for 20 years. The most recent he was honoured with Life membership of the Blyth Bowling Club in 2018. On the green he won the Handicap Champion for 2 years and was a member of the Division 2 premiership team.

He enjoys his family time on holidays, especially driving to Victoria with a six-berth caravan and coming back to Adelaide driving through the Adelaide Hills around the Devil's elbow and going over to Moonta Bay for relaxing, travelling around the countryside looking at the crops with the beloved dogs on the back of the Ute, watching the kids playing sport especially the bowls.

At the age of 58 Malcolm was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease, and then the day after Malcolm and Kaye 50th Wedding Anniversary, he damaged his knee finally succumbing to the wheelchair permanently in years to follow.

2018 was a tough year for the family, especially when Kaye passed away. In June Dad became a resident of Mill Court in Balaklava, it was a huge adjustment for Malcolm not being able to be at farm and pottering around.

During the time at Mill Court, he enjoyed a few activities including cooking, painting, Bingo and card game, but Malcolm was a muchloved resident always annoying the staff with cheeky banter. But his love was still farm and he will continually visit the farm at least 4 to 5 times a week. The farm was his safe place.

2020 comes and we were introduced to COVID, this affected Malcolm mentally as he struggled with being locked down and not visiting the farm regularly. Malcolm's health had slowly deteriorated since that time, and on 6 June 2022 he tested positive for COVID, he recovered from COVID, but unfortunately after a chest infection Malcolm was sent to the Lyell McEwin Hospital where he was diagnosed with pneumonia and passed away peacefully on 22 July 2022.
